With the recent boom in sales in recreational vehicles the last few years, driven by adventure-seeking millennials and retiring baby boomers who are trading in swanky hotel stays for more outdoorsy ventures, it comes as no surprise that the recently-approved Chula Vista bayfront development project will be spearheaded by a state-of-the-art RV park.

The Costa Vista RV Resort, sanctioned by the Port of San Diego board commissioners and to be developed by Sun Communities Inc. and Northgate Resorts LLC, will include 255 overnight spaces, of which 139 are RV stalls and 116 are RV park models — unique, trailer-type units that serve as vacation rentals — on 19 acres.
